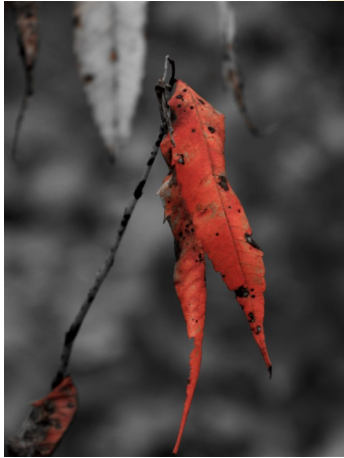

Executive Committee Meeting Notes- October 2, 2018

In attendance: Ray Roper, Ann LeFevre, Stephanie Masgula, Dick Ludwig, Eric Goins, Sarina Cook, Bill Keenan

Ray Roper noted that our next executive committee meeting in the Pullen Room of the Monroe County Public Library would be on Monday, November 5th, because the first Tuesday of November was also Election Day, and the room would not be available for us. He also noted that he would be on vacation that week, and Stephanie Masgula would step in as meeting chair.

The next Photographer of the Month on the PPC website will be Dave Trainer. The Curtain Raiser for the next PPC general meeting will be provided by Maurie Harmon.

The upcoming PPC exhibit at the Smithfield Township Municipal Building will run from November 2, 2018, through January 6, 2019. There is no theme, but photos set in Smithfield Township would be appreciated. Drop-off dates are October 29 through November 2 at Smithfield, or members can bring their contributions to the October 16 general meeting. Hanging will be on Friday, November 2, at 10:30 a.m., and there will be an opening reception that same evening from 6:00 to 8:00 p.m. Further details will be available on our website.

There is a current PPC exhibit on "Fall Colors" hanging at the Shawnee Inn through the end of October. Pick-up is scheduled for October 29 and 30 during business hours.

The PPC Shoot-Out for October is scheduled for Sunday, October 14 (rain date October 21), and it will feature an array of classic cars owned by Deborah and William Whitman. Members will meet at the home of Susan Field, at 210 Beverly Lane in Stroudsburg at 2:30 p.m. for a shuttle to the Whitman's property. Further details are available on the PPC website.

The committee also noted that Eric Goins will have his work included in an exhibit at the Monmouth County Library in New Jersey. And Stephanie Masgula has some photos in the current issue of *Pocono Living* magazine.

Ray Roper noted that date for the next Shoot-Out at one of the Pocono Heritage Land Trust (PHLT) sites is currently uncertain, but will probably be scheduled for some time in November.

The presenter at the next PPC general meeting, on October 16, at 7:00 p.m. at the Monroe Campus of Northampton Community College, Keystone Building, Room 201, will be Anthony Lorenc. He will be speaking on portrait photography and in particular on how to pose subjects in a way that they won't realize that they are posing.

Upcoming presentation topics might include something on photographing flowers by Padma Inguva, and another presentation by Richard Lewis (who did a presentation on "Photographing Abandoned Places" in July).

The December general meeting will be our annual Holiday Social, and we will be asking members to bring along some favorite holiday or winter season photos.

At the next general meeting, we will also be looking for nominees for the club's upcoming election of new officers. The positions of president, 1st vice president, 2nd vice president, secretary, and treasurer will be up for election. Karen Keenan will be handling the balloting process and will be soliciting nominees. The slate of potential officers will be announced at the November general meeting, and voting will take place at the December general meeting.

Ann Lefevre reported that the results of her recent member survey suggests that factors like the cost of printing and framing photos, as well as a sense that one's photos are not good enough to exhibit are the two main factors keeping many members from participating in PPC exhibits. So we will continue to encourage members to participate in a variety of ways, and we will also look into doing some presentations on low-cost printing and framing. The committee is also considering doing a roundtable sessions that will allow members to present some of their photos and get some non-judgmental feedback. We might also solicit digital photos from members and do a presentation of slides and ask for audience feedback.
