Ken Volpe Returns to PPC

Drone use has exploded in every direction from photography, to videography, to surveillance, to life safety, to law enforcement, to inspections, to mapping, to 3D modeling, to agriculture, to construction. They are part of our world and they are here to stay. They come in all shapes and sizes and at our November meeting Ken Volpe will show you some of them from entry level consumer drones to highly advanced multi-camera drones, with price tags ranging from

\$300 to well over \$10,000 and everything in between. In this session, Ken will briefly discuss the various types of drones in the market, how they are used, along with their capabilities. He'll then focus on their specific applicability and capability to take your photography and videography to a new level, both figuratively and literally! He'll have a few drones on display that are at various price points and he'll demonstrate flying one or more of them to showcase how easy they are to operate and how immensely capable they are. Ken is an FAA Licensed Remote Pilot in Command and he will talk about the various regulations that exist in the world of drones and how these regulations are changing. He'll also dishobby-use versus cuss commercial-use of drones and the differences in regulations as well as where to get training and the path to become a commercial remote pilot in command. Attendees are encouraged to ask questions and, depending on time and circumstances may have an opportunity to test fly a drone!

Executive Committee Meeting Notes- November 5, 2018

PPC Executive Committee Meeting Notes – 11-5-18

In attendance: Stephanie Masgula, Ann LeFevre, Eric Goins, Dick Ludwig, Sarina Cook, Bill Keenan

Stephanie Masgula chaired tonight's meeting in the absence of Ray Roper.

It was reported that the PPC photo display at Pocono Valley Manor will be presenting photos by Ken Winham and Bob Renner for the next two months. Bob and Sarina Cook will hang photos in Jan and Feb of 2019.

The next PPC shoot-out will take place on November 17 from 2:00 to 4:00 p.m. at Stroudsburg Foto on Main Street in Stroudsburg. Participants will get three random topics and will be asked to go out around town and shoot three photos for each topic. The photos will then be uploaded at the store for viewing and feedback.

A December shoot-out will take place at the Gamut Art Gallery on 8th Street in Stroudsburg on Monday, December 3, at 11:00 a.m. The gallery has a lot of museum-like odds and ends that are perfect for some close-up shots.

We also discussed a New Jersey Federation of Camera Club (NJFCC) exhibit that is open to PCC members. November 11 at midnight is the deadline for submissions, and those photos accepted for the exhibit will need to be dropped off at the Monmouth County (NJ) Library on January 2, 2019.

The club will be looking for someone to run point on the Spring 2019 Scavenger Hunt, which is conducted jointly with the Palmerton Camera Club. Since PPC is in charge this year, there might be some changes in rules and procedures, but they will be announced as they are decided upon. We might want to expand the use of post-processing on this year's submissions. We also discussed asking Tom O'Connor, a local art expert, to take part as judge. Ann LeFevre will speak to him as the date draws closer.

The committee discussed the nominees for the December ballot for the PPC Executive Committee. They include: President- Ray Roper 1st VP- Ann LeFevre 2nd VP- Eric Goins Secretary- Bill Keenan Treasurer- Dick Ludwig Webmaster- Bob Hare The ballot will be presented to the membership at large at the November 20 general meeting.

The committee also discussed upcoming general meeting topics for January and February. For the January meeting we will ask members to submit some photos that they believe could be improved, and some of our experts, and members in general will offer their suggestions in a round table format.

For the February general meeting, we expect to do another "What Would You Do?" session, in which we present a number of member photos to the group and ask members to do some interesting post-processing on some of them, to see what our imaginative members can come up with.

The committee will also be looking for potential new speakers to give presentations throughout the rest of 2019.
